

"It was a dark and stormy night...."

So begins a legendary adventure that stretches across both time and space, and challenges what is real, and what we believe to be real. With only three curious old women as their guides, misfit teen Meg, reluctant boyfriend Calvin and wise little brother Charles Wallace must step through the veil of the universe to save their father, their family and the Earth as we know it. With love, hope and courage, the three are on a mission that leads them from the warm embrace of monsters, to the cold eyes of conformity in a race to find Meg's father and to find themselves. Blending science, fantasy, and philosophy, Madeleine L'Engle's beloved modern classic, A Wrinkle In Time, is full of surprises, charming characters and suspenseful obstacles.

"Maybe I don't like being different, but I don't want to be like everyone else either."

Science Fiction adaptations for the stage aren't typical, but behind the effects, at its heart is often an allegory that asks us to face complex or sensitive subjects without addressing them directly. Like other classics of the genre: Fahrenheit 451, Star Trek or the Twilight Zone, A Wrinkle In Time offers a unique take on a number of compelling lessons that are just as relevant today as they were when it was written in the 1960's: uniqueness vs. conformity, good vs. evil, how appearances can be deceiving, and where each one of us fits into the greater picture of life. By concentrating on the themes of the story, and bringing plenty of technical wizardry to dazzle and amaze, A Wrinkle In Time will be like few other theatre productions on the Northern Colorado stage.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL TROUPES ATTENTION!!!

Be sure to read the specific notes for your troupe. If you have any conflicts, problems or questions, please contact your director immediately to avoid any last-minute crisis.

#### **Dress Rehearsals**

<u>Mandatory</u> dress rehearsals precede all shows. All <u>students must be on-time</u> because this is the only opportunity to run the show in the space with lighting and full tech before there's an audience.

Recommended items to bring:

- Sack dinner (shows at Debut) or eat before you arrive (shows at different venue)
- Button-front make-up shirt
- Brush and comb
- Personal make-up or accessories if desired
- Costume accessories from home if desired
- Water bottle (Please no sugary or caffeinated beverages)

Debut provides a theatrical make-up and hair kit, as well as instruction and assistance in application. However, you may choose to do your own ahead of time.

Friends and siblings are *not* welcome to attend the dress rehearsal or to "hang out" backstage. The directors cannot be responsible for anyone other than troupe members.

#### **During the Show**


Please, <u>no flash photography</u> during the performance. It's distracting to other audience members, and, more importantly, it can be dangerous to the performers on stage.

Also, please don't make the monitoring of actors' family and friends the Director's responsibility.

#### **After the Show**

At the end of the show, students must **check out with the director before leaving**. Costumes are to be hung up and props are also to be turned in. This is important theatre protocol to be learned.
