MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL Costume Design

Have you ever been curious about how to be a Costume designer? Have you been wowed by grandiose costumes seen anywhere from the Lincoln Center stage to Broadway? Do you have a knack for creativity, art and design? Then this is the class for you! In this four day workshop we will explore all elements of costume design: from drawing, to fabric, to character analysis, to finally costuming a show (of your choice!) Join me in this exclusive class for a fun romp through the world of costuming!

Masks are required and will be worn at all times in the building. Your temperature will be taken at the door, and all social distancing guidelines will be followed. The final day will have staggered calls so we can safely work in the costume closet together.

AGES 11-15 Makeup Mania

Putting on makeup is not only fun, it's an essential skill for every actor. Students will learn basic theatre makeup, old-age techniques, wounds and other kinds of special effects. On the final day, students will create their own character and bring them to life using a combination of techniques from the previous days work, apply the makeup themselves, and then explore their characters through improvisation games and exercises.

This class will be a hybrid class of Zoom and meet-in-person at Debut. For safety reasons, if this class exceeds 6 students, we will have staggered calls the day we work together at Debut. Masks are required and all social distancing guidelines will be followed.

Saving Scheherazade

The collection of tales called *The Arabian Nights* recounts how Scheherazade told a story every night to keep the king from killing her in the morning. The king married a wife every evening and killed her at dawn... but he couldn't kill Scheherazade without hearing the end of her fascinating tales! This two-week Zoom workshop plays on that legend with an exploration into *The Arabian Nights* and the wonders of oral storytelling. Like Scheherazade, workshop participants will be called upon to consider what makes a good story—and then practice producing these good stories on the fly! As a part of this workshop, you can expect to spend time writing, improvising, and working as a team. You can also expect to be exposed to some of Scheherazade's tales. The workshop's final session will be a class effort to extend one of Scheherazade's stories using the storytelling skills developed up to that point. After all, with her life on the line, even a master like Scheherazade might welcome help!

The Storyteller and the Healer

This two-week Zoom workshop focuses on oral-storytelling—and particularly the power of oral stories to heal. During the first week of this workshop, each participant will create and develop a basic story that responds to hurts they see in their community. They will then practice and polish the performance of this tale. In the last session, participants will each share a 3-8 minute story of their own design. Major themes of the workshop will include self-analysis, story discussion, audience awareness, plotline/character/setting development, elements of delivery, and establishing a storyteller aura!

AGES 12-17

Between The Lines

There is a lot of writing and thinking that goes between the lines of a script. This two-week Zoom workshop focuses on the character development, context awareness, and sensitivity to everyday dialogue that goes into creating a good scene in a play. To explore and practice these elements of playwriting, participants will, as a group, be given a basic myth, legend, or piece of folklore. They will each then be assigned a character from this story and develop a bio/monologue for this character over the course of the first week. In the second week, each participant will take the characters developed by the group as a whole and write their own adaptation of a specific scene from the story in question. The goal of the workshop will be to consider what motivations and factors contribute to dialogue in a scene—as well as how to accommodate the necessities of plot, genre, and character with that dialogue.
